
1. Begin with a 2 : 1 rectangle.






3. Pinch as indicated.




4. Divide in 6 x 3.




5. Pinch as indicated.




6. Divide in 18 x 9.




7. Divide in 36 x 18.




8. Cut and remove excess paper, keeping only the two 34 x 8 rectangles.




9. The folds between the two rectangles should be flipped. Step 10 will focus on the lower rectangle.




10. NOTE: on the next step, the top of the rectangle is closed and the bottom is opened.




11. Mark the folds through both layers on the whole length.




12. Cut as indicated. The cuts go no further than the underlying edges.




13. Reverse fold all resulting flaps.





13. Open sink all resulting corners.




15. Fold up both edges. The next step will be seen from the top.




16. For each intersection, pull opposing flaps as far as possible, twisting along in the process, and flatten evenly using shown creases. See CP on the right for reference.




17. Fold both corners in.




18. Unit complete. Repeat on the other rectangle from step 9, but with reversed colors.




19. Turn over the second unit only, from left to right.




20. Insert the first unit into the second and superpose them along their length.




21. Insert the second unit into the first.



22. Weave through the whole length, each time alternating between the two units.



23. Note the resulting arrow pattern. Lock the model by sliding both ends in their respective unit.



24. Finished arrow bracelet.
