

## HOW TO FOLD THE UNIVERSAL

There you go. Become familiar with open sinks and the standard origami techniques before attempting this model. You will need them.

Crease pattern and folded model shown to scale.




1. Start with the colored side up. Crease along the diagonals.




2. Crease in half vertically and horizontally.




3. Fold the bottom right corner to the vertical center line, pinch where indicated. The new crease should touch the top right corner.




4. Fold the bottom right corner to the new mark, make a small crease and unfold.




5. Starting from the new mark, make a diagonal crease along the whole sheet.




6. Make a crease starting from the middle of the left side and ending on the top right corner, creasing sharply only where indicated.




7. Fold the left edge to the newly made crease line, pinching only where indicated.




8. Fold the bottom corner diagonally, passing through the new mark.




9. Pleat along existing creases.



10. Turn the model over.





11. Pleat the upper layer so that it matches the far side.




12. Fold the thin edge behind to line up with the existing edges.









15. Turn the sheet over.


16. Crease four angle bisectors.




17. Fold and unfold the edge through the indicated crease intersections.




18. Crease diagonally through the indicated crease intersections.




19. Fold two corners in at the intersection of creases.



20. Make two rabbit ears.




21. Preliminary fold.




22. Rotate counter-clockwise 45°

24. Crimp the flaps, repeat behind.




25. Opensink the tip.




26. Reversefold two flaps outwards.




27. Valley-fold the upper flap downwards; repeat behind.




28. Open the model by lifting the bottom near flap; the model will not lie flat.




29. Press flat the base of the two side flaps near the center of the model.




30. Pinch each flap and form a rabbit ear, flattening the right side flap upwards and the left side flap downwards.




31. Untuck a small amount of paper from four corners, forming new pleats.




32. Flip the model over.




33. Reverse fold four corners.



34. Unsink a layer from inside of each pocket.



35. Flip the model over.



36. Unwrap the thin edge of paper from the two flaps.
