


Christmas Flower

Modular mandala designed by Matthew Green.


I like to use this as a Christmas decoration. I recommend using foil-backed paper, both for the brightness and to make the curls stay in place.

Recommended paper size: 6" / 15 cm




Precrease.


Fold the top two corners to the center.

Fold and unfold.



Turn over horizontally.




Fold along the precreases.


Fold to the center and unfold.


Fold down and crease sharply through all the layers. Unfold.


Unfold to step 4.



along the precreases.






Fond and unfold, creasing sharply through all the layers.


Fold the sides to the center. Crease firmly, as there are many layers.






Fold up the corner.




Curl the corners, separating them from each other.

Flip over horizontally.




